Our curriculum is interconnected and builds upon itself.

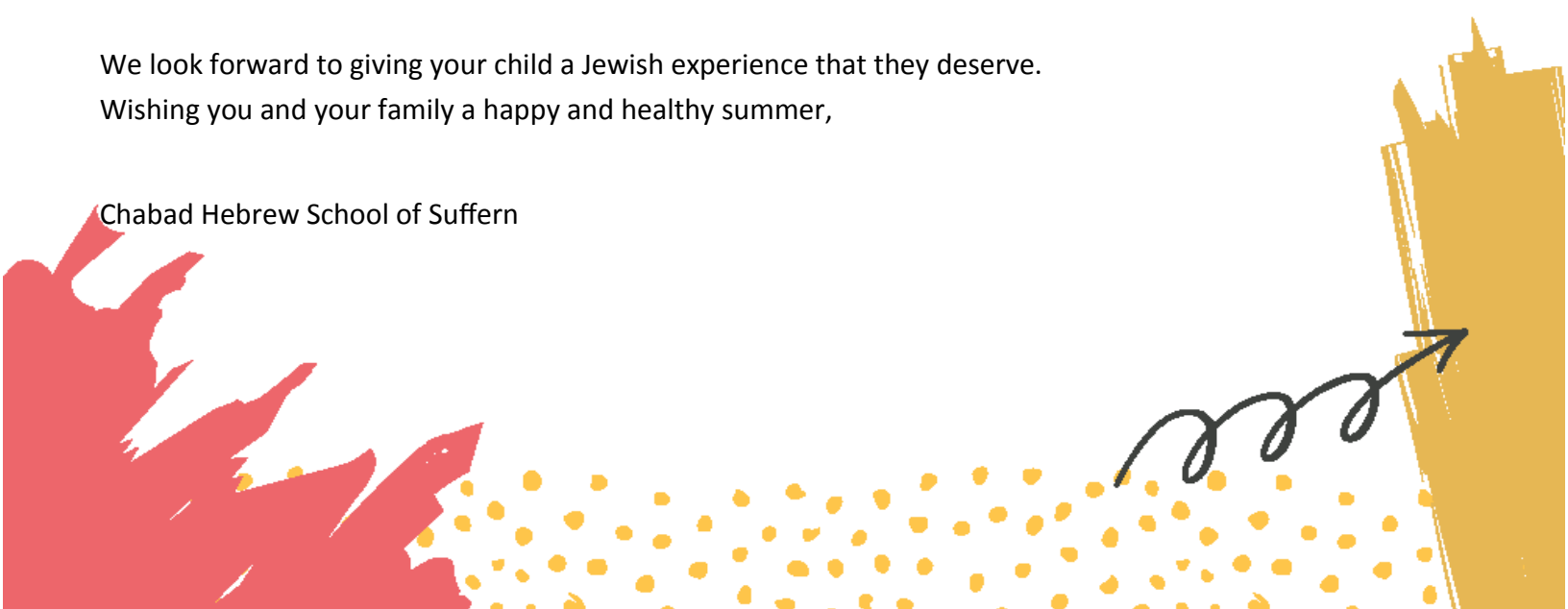
Each lesson synthesizes three main components: Torah knowledge, Torah relevance, and a commitment to fostering a positive disposition toward the subject matter.

Chabad Hebrew School Curriculum

CHS is dedicated to providing a positive environment that is sure to engage the mind and heart, thereby forming an everlasting impression - to last a lifetime. We go to great lengths to create a warm and exciting classroom atmosphere by incorporating art projects, songs, games, and contests into all of our lesson plans. Our school is a contemporary learning center that is committed to making each lesson relevant and interesting. Our “hands-on” teaching style allows the children to experience authentic Judaism. CHS will teach children about caring for others, bringing the lessons to life, by enhancing their Midot Tovot - true morals and values. At Chabad the children are happy to come and learn because learning is fun! With this in mind we have prepared a full and thorough curriculum including the following subjects.

1. Hebrew Reading

Our Hebrew reading curriculum - **Aleph Champ** - is the latest educational breakthrough around. Modeled after the Karate/Martial Arts motivational philosophy of color coded levels and testing, it provides excitement and inspiration, leading the student into a winning cycle of learning. Learning is on an individual basis, and each child is encouraged at his/her level.

2. Torah, Jewish History & Israel

The children will be introduced to the characters and stories of the Bible. An overview of Jewish history starting with creation to the giving of the Torah to modern day Israel will be taught through interactive stories and art projects. The students will gain an appreciation for our heritage and culture that has been preserved throughout the ages. They will study the Torah Portions, providing them with practical lessons that apply to our daily lives. They will also attain an affection for the uniqueness of Israel, our homeland.

3. Jewish Values & Ethics

Using age-appropriate textbooks students will read and discuss real stories and case scenarios that have practical application to our everyday life. They will understand that our religion is based on a G-d given set of values and morals and that the “norm” is not always right. Beginning with the origin of the Mitzvot, our students will explore a personal connection to Judaism.

4. Shabbat & Holidays

We will provide a deeper understanding of Shabbat by exploring its traditions, customs, and the reasons behind them. Hands-on lessons for each Jewish holiday will fill the calendar as we begin with learning about the High Holidays and continue throughout the entire school year. By the end of the year, the students will have a deeper understanding and appreciation of each holiday, its traditions, and its customs.

Hand crafted and decorated Menorahs, honey dishes, Seder plates, Shofars, Matzah baking and more will bring our holidays to life and enable the children to bring home a taste of Jewish life.

Chabad Hebrew School will also host holiday & Shabbat celebrations for students and their families.

5. Extra Curricular

Chabad Hebrew School offers a variety of exciting extra curricular activities such as Friday night Shabbat dinners, family fun days, and contests. These events will allow our students to experience Judaism in its entirety. A point system based on in-class and out-of-class participation will allow students to reach different award levels.

Programs:

First Taste

Grades kindergarten– 1st grade

Sundays 10:00 am - 12:00 pm

Tier II

Grades 2-5

This program offers a more advanced Hebrew and Jewish studies curriculum. The students learn to read Hebrew and gain an appreciation for the who, what, when and why of Jewish life and tradition.

The transition from child to teenager is an important milestone in any child's life. These lessons give a child the tools he or she needs to properly navigate life as a responsible adult.



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Important Notice:

CHS welcomes every child, regardless of one's religious background or level of observance. CHS does not require membership or prior affiliations as a condition for enrollment. Acceptance to Hebrew School does not validate in any way you or your child's Judaism. The process of being Bar and Bat Mitzvah through Chabad will require proof of mothers Judaism based on the guidelines of the Rabbinical court.

Registrations Submitted after July 15th will be charged an additional \$100.

Attendance:

The greatest gift that you as a parent can give to your child is constant encouragement. Too much is never enough! The first step in the right direction for parents and children is to realize that attendance is the key to a successful school year. Children who take days off not only miss important school work, but also create an atmosphere of "Hebrew school isn't really that important." Parents should schedule all appointments on non-school days. Students who miss class on a regular basis disrupt their learning and the learning of other students.

Confidential Information:

It is of great importance for the teacher to have any information which can provide for the optimum learning situation. Information of a physical, social, or psychological nature can aid a teacher in planning instructions for each child. Without this knowledge, teachers are handicapped and may be unable to provide the kind of support needed. Such information should be transmitted either in writing, or by a private conference with the director, who will make it known to the appropriate teacher.

First Aid:

First Aid Minor injuries will be taken care of by the school staff. Should anything serious occur, G-d forbid, the parents or emergency contact will be contacted and the child will be taken to the nearest hospital if necessary.
